## From the Desk of Mayor David Runfeldt

I have received many questions regarding the property re-valuation process and what it all means so far. Most important to address is that the increase you receive in the amount of your assessment does NOT mean that your taxes are going up by the same rate. The re-valuation merely sets theoretical current market values to all property. I am sure that you will all agree that the assessed value your property had before the re-val was much lower than the market value of your property. As all property is brought up to current market value, your tax rate will drop accordingly. The biggest concern I have heard is that the new assessed value is actually over market value. This is the result of the re-val being started when property values were near their peak, and the new numbers given to you during the current economic downturn. I want you all to know, that the assessment you have received is not necessarily final...there is much more work that the borough will perform on the assessments over the next few months to make them closer to market conditions at the time the numbers are finalized. I encourage all property owners to take advantage reviewing your assessment with the representatives of the re-valuation firm which is conducting the re-val for the borough. You should receive the information on how to set up an appointment for review directly from the firm.

A few weeks ago, was the inauguration of our new President. There was much hope given during President Obama's inauguration address. Regardless of party affiliation, I hope that the coming years will see much progress in the quality of life for all American's and I wish our new President much luck in achieving his goals for our great nation.

The budget process has begun for the 2009 municipal budget. Budget hearings which began in January continue during this month and are open to the public. Please contact the borough clerk's office for dates and times. We are faced once again this year with the threat of reduced aid from the state, however, we will not know exactly how much until further into the year.

Thanks to the research of Council members Ray Kerwin and Ann Thompson, the borough is looking into being included in the New Jersey Shares program. This program offers financial assistance to families for various utilities. More information will be available from my office on how to take advantage of these programs once our participation has been finalized.

**Throwing snow on roadways** - With the arrival of wintry weather also comes some of the common problems we face as a community. One of the most fielded complaints we receive from citizens is the act of throwing or blowing snow into plowed roadways. While there certainly is no criminal or malicious intent by persons doing this, there is a real danger of causing a serious accident that could inflict injury or even claim a life. When clearing sidewalks and driveways please make every effort to direct the snow onto other portions, such as a yard, or any area away from a plowed roadway.

The effect of putting the snow onto the roadways is a possible freezing over and the potential for a motorist to lose control of a vehicle with disastrous results. Not only is this dangerous it is against Borough Ordinance 185-1, "Placing of Obstructions in Streets". As a side note it is also important to clear all sidewalks within 12 hours of daylight after a snowfall. Oftentimes children walking to school have had to walk in dangerous icy roadways due to impassable sidewalks. This ordinance is covered under Borough Ordinance 185-2. We ask your cooperation in this to keep the children and other pedestrian's safe.

**Use of turn signals 39:4-126** – This statute is violated in two ways and is the cause of many accidents and injuries. The first is when motorists leave a turn signal on for extended periods without realizing it. The result often is another motorist pulling their vehicle out in front of the offender. The offending motorist then continues in a straight direction with the turn signal on. The result is a serious motor vehicle accident.

The second way this statute is violated is that a motorist traveling on a roadway will all of a sudden slow down their vehicle and makes a turn. Again, other motorists on the roadway are affected by these actions. It's important to realize that all actions by a vehicle on a roadway affect others perceptions, observations and their own reactions to the offenders' operations. Please be alert, considerate of other motorists, and operate motor vehicles in a safe manner.

### Carbon Monoxide Poisoning Kills

With the colder weather comes the concern for Carbon monoxide (CO) poisoning. This season, the NJ Poison Information and Education System (NJPIES) has already received over 45 calls for assistance in managing patients who were exposed to CO.

### Life-Saving Tips

- Open flues when fireplaces are in use
- Chimneys should be inspected and cleaned annually
- **DO NOT** idle the car inside the garage
- Use the correct fuel in kerosene heaters
- **NEVER** use charcoal indoors or in areas with inadequate ventilation
- Have a trained professional inspect, clean and tune-up central heating systems like the furnace every year
- Gas appliances must have adequate ventilation so that carbon monoxide will not accumulate
- Have operational carbon monoxide detectors in your home especially near sleeping areas

### Remember, Help is Just a Phone Call Away!

If you suspect Carbon monoxide poisoning, call the Poison Help Hotline (1-800-222-1222) to speak with a poison information specialist for immediate treatment advice as well as for prevention information. Even after a serious poisoning, symptoms may not appear until many hours later. **DO NOT** wait until symptoms appear. The hotline is accessible 24 hours per day, 7 days a week. Services are free and confidential. Hearing impaired may call 973-926-8008.
